MOVING FROM LENT TO EASTER

Early in April our parish community concludes its Lenten journey of spiritual conditioning. On Wednesdays we were exposed to Responsive Prayer One and Evening Prayer, to the readings and psalms of Daily Prayer, and to the Prayer Lists of our members. We also worked through a biblical study (led by Mrs. Natalie Smith) on five of the Seven Signs in John's Gospel.

This six-week journey of spiritual conditioning was and is preparing our members and friends for the liturgies of Holy Week – Passion (or Palm) Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Day. For the Church this is the premier week of the year because it takes us into the actual center of the world's redemption from the destructive and deadly realities of sin, Satan, and death.

We take part in these liturgies not because we have to, but because we have been rescued from the anxieties and horrors of living for one's self. The liturgies of Holy Week are unique and the Lord's people are steadily encouraged to participate in them. This involves us changing our routines that week so the liturgies can cross our lives, but it is what the Lord's people do.

Our redemption from this world's life was not easily accomplished. That is why it is vital for the Lord's people to be exposed to the events that surface in the course of this Week.

The world honestly thinks one can have the resurrection without the Jerusalem entrance on Sunday, the gift of the Lord's Supper on Thursday, the crucifixion on Friday, and the Son's visit to hell on Saturday; but, tragically and pathetically, the world is wrong with that assessment.

Remember that Lent's six weeks were conditioning and toughening us as the Lord's people so we can stride into the world-shaking and world-redeeming events of Holy Week. They enable us as the Lord's people to emerge on Easter Day, fully imbedded in the Son's crucifixion and resurrection!

From Steward Builders: The Parable of the Rice Field

There is a parable told in India about the selfish man who inherited a rice field. The first year the man irrigated the field and it was fruitful. The water, in fact, flowed onto his neighbor's field and this too produced a bountiful harvest.

But the next year the selfish man decided: Why should I let this water flow through my field into his? Water is precious, and I must keep it. So, he built a dam. This prevented the water from flowing into his neighbor's field, but it proved to be disastrous to his own crop as well. Irrigation water nourished the field only if it flowed. When it did not move, because of the dam, the water became stagnant and the field a swamp.

We own no rice fields. Still, the parable is clear. Think of what we have inherited from God; think of all He has given us. If we are selfish and keep all He has given us, our lives become stagnant, a dismal swamp of mere existence. But if we give back to God by giving to others, both the giver and the receiver share in the fruits of God's love.

Dear Lord, help us to be like the flowing waters of the parable, letting the many gifts You have given us flow through us to others in your kingdom so they may come to know your Love and forgiving Grace.
