## FROM PASTOR VOGES

Since we observed the Son's Birth on December 25th, the Lord's people are seeing Sunday after Sunday how that Birth impacts their lives along with the lives of the world's people. His people, though, recognize how such seeing is not easily done. The world, wrapped up with and committed to its own gods, initially pushes back against the Son's Birth. This, however, does not dismay or dispirit the Lord's people. They have been guided to recognize that the Birth leads to the Son's dying and rising.

Thus they are determined to be continually exposed to the Lord's redeeming activity so they can faithfully reflect it to the people around them. This year the Epiphany season runs out to its full eight weeks (Easter Day will be as late as it can be – April 21, 2019!) This means we will have much more time to explore how the impact of the Son's Birth extends into our lives and beyond. Let us remember that such exploration is always framed by the Lord's Scriptures, Baptism, Forgiveness, and his Supper.

As your interim pastor during these months, remember that the Church's ministry is grounded in the Holy Trinity's activity of Baptism and Ordination. Rooted in the classical Lutheran tradition, we pastors are to proclaim, serve, and teach the Gospel. My tasks with you will include presiding and preaching in the weekend liturgies, leading special liturgies, and calling on the parish's members and friends.

## CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

There is no more important decision a Congregation faces than the calling of its Pastor. We believe God has a design for Mt. Olive and has already made his selection. The Call process began and continues with prayer – prayer in all services, prayer in our Bible studies, and individual prayer to help us identify our new Pastor.

We're being guided through the process by District representatives starting with President Denninger, District Facilitator Pastor Mark Schroeder, and our Circuit Visitor Pastor David Panning. On January 8th, we received the official Call List with the names of seven Pastors from four different states. The committee has been provided with the Pastors' Personal Information Form (PIF) and Self-Evaluation Tool (SET) that have specific information ranging from personal backgrounds to preferences in types of worship services. On January 22, the Committee began the process of identifying Pastors most compatible with the vision expressed in the Mt. Olive Congregational Profile. Once narrowed down, we will have phone interviews with several candidates and eventually in-person interviews with finalists. The Committee is focused and wants to thank you for your prayerful support.

***“You will come to the grave in full vigor.” Job 5:26 NIV.***

Author Norman Cousins said, “No disease is more lethal than the boredom that follows retirement.” Here’s a true story of a lady in her eighties who went to her doctor for a checkup. He asked if she stayed active. She gave him a big smile and said, “I jog about four or five miles every day.” Surprised, he told her she needed to be careful and not overdo it. “Take it easy,” he suggested. She took his words to heart and decided to slow down. She reduced her jogs to slow walks, and cut back to one or two days a week. Within a year she was dead. After hearing about her death, the doctor who’d given her such advice told a friend, “Never again will I tell a patient who’s doing so well to take it easy.”

The Bible is filled with the stories of people who *lived on* because they had something to *live for!* Remember Caleb? At eighty-five he attacked the giants in the hill country, drove them out, and became a land developer (Joshua 14:9-13). And how about Noah? He began building the ark when he was five hundred years old. And a hundred years later he helped to start the world all over again. Age means nothing unless you’re cheese! And wrinkles, gray hair, and spots on your hands mean less than nothing. As long as God chooses to leave you on this earth, don’t just exist—live! Claim the promise: “You will come to the grave in full vigor.” Keep dreaming. Accept new challenges. And don’t even *think* about taking it easy!

This is from my devotional and want to extend the challenge to everyone throughout.

## KID'S KORNER



**A MESSAGE OF

Make this valentine for a family member or friend.



**What you need:**

- 10 wooden craft sticks
- Painter's tape
- Markers
- A photo and glue (optional)
- Craft knife (and adult help)
- Ribbon or a rubber band

**What you do:**

1. Set the sticks side by side. Secure with two tape strips.
2. Flip the sticks over. Draw (or glue on) a picture or write a message or Bible verse. If using glue, let dry.
3. Flip the sticks again and remove tape. If you glued on a photo, have an adult help cut the sticks (and photo) apart.
4. Secure the sticks with ribbon or a rubber band.
5. Deliver the gift and invite the recipient to assemble the puzzle.
