Pray for Pastor David Panning, our Circuit Visitor, as he guides us in the call process.

Pray that our call committee will to discern God's will as they develop a process for reviewing the candidates.

Pray that Pastor Williams and Pastor Voges will continue to preach the Word and Sacraments, and minister to our congregation and guests.

Pray that Lay Minister Bill Boykin, Elder Chairperson Charlie Sandt, and secretary Mary Keller will be filled with wisdom and discernment from the Holy Spirit as they keep up with the day-to-day challenges during our time of transition.

TRANSITION COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Mt. Olive Transition Committee has now completed its work. The Congregational Profile has been finalized, distributed to the Congregation, and sent to the LCMS Southeastern District Office. On October 16th, Southeastern District President John Denninger along with Pastor Mark Schroeder, the Region's Mission Engagement Facilitator, met at Mt. Olive with the Transition Committee, Church Council and the Board of Elders to update them on the next steps and answer any questions. It was a great meeting with lots of dialogue. Everyone came away with a better understanding of the process and the feeling that we are on the right track.

Around the beginning of December, President Denninger will have developed the Official Call List with the names of potential pastors for Mt. Olive. The Call Committee will then begin their work of prayerful consideration as they review all the names and go through in-depth research to determine the top two or three candidates. At that point, there will be a Call Service where the Confirmed Membership of Mt. Olive will vote by secret ballot.



2019 will be a very busy and special time at Mt. Olive. I urge you to pray for President Denninger as he spends the next few weeks developing our Call List. We know that God has a design for Mt. Olive and has already chosen our next Pastor. Our work as a congregation, under the guidance and timing of the Holy Spirit, will be to discern God's will.

November 18th is a very important day for Mt. Olive. This day has been set aside as our "Commitment Day". It is the day when we end our formal 2018-2019 Stewardship program and pledge our time, talents, and treasures to God by placing our commitment cards in the Stewardship box.

Stewardship is a topic that many Christians do not like to talk about. Often, people feel pressured to give. They feel they are sacrificing the money they worked hard for. Many believe that after paying their bills and buying the things they need and want, they don't have money left to give to the church.

God's Word tells us to look at our giving in another way. God calls us to "joyful, first fruits, sacrificial" giving where we first set aside a portion of our income for the work of His church.

"Honor the LORD with your wealth, with the first fruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine." Proverbs 3: 9-10



"The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

I know personally, this is a very tough concept to follow and one that requires our full faith in God's Grace. We must fully trust in God's promise to love us and take care of us.

At Mt. Olive, our stewardship commitment is a very personal act. It is totally between us, as individuals, and God. Once we drop our commitment cards in the box on Commitment Sunday, no one will ever open it until you yourself open it when it is mailed back to you during the next Stewardship campaign. No one will follow-up with you to remind you what you promised God.

While your commitment is private, your giving is extremely important to the ministry of Mt. Olive. For our church to continue to grow as the church God knows we can be, we must all follow God's command to give. I ask each of you to take the time to pray and seek God's guidance as you fill out your commitment card. Please take the time to look at some Bible verses concerning stewardship and remember that we, as the church at Mt. Olive, will reap what we sow.

Outlined below are the goals of the Board of Social Ministry for this church year:

Within our Church: Our focus this year will be to research get-to-know each other opportunities within our church by networking with each of the Boards, especially the Elders and **YOU**, to explore activities for support of our seniors and members in need. We will also explore travel and gatherings for fun and Christian education.

Within our Community: Our research this year will reach out to the community to discover the needs of our school district, community service support departments (Fire Department, Law Enforcement, EMS), and explore our opportunity to support a Special Needs Park being developed at Saluda Shoals. We will need *volunteers* in these efforts. Be ready!



Ministries to the Needy:

Sharing God’s Love. Please take a moment to visit Mt. Olive’s Facebook page to view a video of the services offered by Sharing God’s Love ranging from food and clothing to counseling. We currently have a small shopping cart in front of the office area for collections. Our goal is to see that cart overflowing each Sunday. We will also be recruiting a few members to *volunteer* at the facility to assist with the intake and sorting of goods. Please pray about how you might embrace this opportunity to spend a day or two helping at the facility.



Homeless Soup Kitchen: We will be assisting the downtown soup kitchen once a month to feed the needy during lunch. The prep work is done; we just need to provide a friendly face and the ability to dip some soup into a bowl. *Are you willing to help?*

Habitat for Humanity: Those of us who have garages full of tools, love Lowe’s and an opportunity to make something: *Here’s your chance.* We will be networking with Habitat for Humanity for the opportunity to help build a new home for a needy person in the midlands. Spending a weekend or two, hearing the sound of hammers, circular saws, drills, smelling the aroma of saw dust while standing up a new wall would be the memory of a lifetime knowing you helped someone who could otherwise never have a home of their own.

If you feel a tug at our heart, as Matthew West sings “Do Something”, please consider joining our Social Ministries Team. There are so many needs in this world and we need hands to “do something.” Call any member of our team to ask questions and hopefully join us.

In our beautiful land of freedom, we are witnessing sadness, evil and confusion. God can fix this if we allow him to. Our charge:

“Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. 

**STEPHEN MINISTRY:
THE MINISTRY OF LISTENING**

Think of a time when you really felt cared for. Chances are someone focused on what you had to say, was attentive to your needs, and listened to how you felt instead of telling you how you should feel or what you should do.

Listening is one of the most powerful ministry tools at your disposal. It demonstrates that you care about the other person. In Stephen Ministry, a great deal of time is spent in teaching and practicing listening skills because of its importance as a caregiving tool.

Anybody can become a more caring listener by understanding and applying these six concepts:

1. **Listening is active.** Focus on what the other person is saying instead of thinking of what you will say next. Look at him or her as you listen.
2. **Listening takes patience.** Often you need to build trust before someone will open up to you.
3. **Listening involves more than just words.** Pay attention not only to what is said, but also to what is not said. Pay attention to body language, too.
4. **Good listeners aren't completely silent.** They restate key ideas to make sure they understood correctly. They ask focused questions to encourage the person to reach a little deeper.
5. **Listening happens over time.** One conversation might build upon an earlier one. Listen for recurring themes and contradictions. These might be areas to explore more.
6. **Listening is confidential.** A great way to build that trust and to show the person you really care for him or her is to maintain confidentiality and privacy.



Jesus was the model of a good listener. By listening to what people had to say, he demonstrated how much he really cared about them, and then he gave them just what they needed. Listening is a great gift that we can give to one another, and one we all use in order to make Mt. Olive a more caring place.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM: “LOVE THY NEIGHBOR”

Bill Boykin and I recently attended the LCMS Southeastern District Fall 2018 Regional Professional Church Workers Conference, where we attended a presentation by Rev. Dr. Paul Mueller. Dr. Mueller is currently a professor at Concordia University Portland and has spent the majority of his career as a missionary in Africa and Southeast Asia. His presentation centered on the changes we must make in our perceptions of others so that we might be more successful in presenting the Gospel.



One of the key concepts that he discussed was, *our neighbor’s reality does not match our assumptions about our neighbor* (my paraphrasing). That is to say we need to know and understand our neighbors values, priorities and points of view before we can present the Gospel and bring them into a relationship with the one true God.



Here’s an interesting anecdote he gave for this concept. A group of Zulu natives, whom he was teaching asked, “Why do people stand when the Gospel lesson is read? He replied, “To show respect.” Their response was, “When the Zulu chief arrives, we sit down.” He had several other examples of how a seemingly minor action on our part can be perceived as a response with a different meaning than what we intended.

As a closing comment, Dr. Mueller said, “We are who we are, where we are for a very specific purpose.” Amen.

The earliest official reference to using "Taps" at a military funeral is described in an 1891 manual. During the Civil War, a Union soldier "was buried at a time when the battery occupied an advanced position concealed in the woods." Because it wasn't safe to fire the customary three volleys over the grave, Captain John Tidball decided the sounding of "Taps" would be an appropriate substitute ceremony.

Previously, "Taps" signaled the end of a soldier's workday, but it has since come to honor the end of his or her earthly life. Horace Trim's lyrics remind us of God's constant presence:
