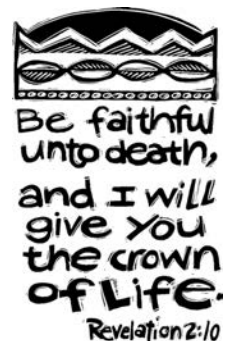
This is the last newsletter article that I will write as the Pastor of Mt. Olive Lutheran Church to appear in our monthly newsletter, better known as *The Olive Leaves*. Therefore, I want to thank both God and you all out loud one last time for the privilege he has given me of being your pastor now for over 20 years.

Neither Lisa nor I could ever thank our gracious God and you enough for all the years we have been privileged to share in this wonderful “partnership in the Gospel” with you (Philippians 1:6). So, in closing, please let me share with you one more time, one of the greatest promises our Crucified, Risen, Ascended, and Glorified Savior has ever made to us. In Revelation 2:10 Jesus tells us: **“Be faithful unto death and I will give you the crown of life!”**

Crowns, of course, are symbols of glory and power. Throughout the history of the world, various kings and queens have spent innumerable riches trying to create glorious crowns that would amaze their royal subjects as the highest symbols of success and honor and power.

Nevertheless, crowns are not something that people can simply seize for themselves. Those who possess a much greater power must bestow them upon them.

In Revelation 2:10 we read of a very special crown that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ promises He will give one day to those who believe in him. This is the crown of eternal life. Our Lord won the right to give us this crown of life because his is the greatest power of all. To him belongs the power of the resurrection. Christ defeated sin, death and the devil so that his victory is now complete. He rules the Church in glory from the Father’s right hand on heaven’s throne and to him belong all power and authority in heaven and on earth.



We Christians, however, know that it all depends upon God’s rich mercy. It is the good pleasure of God, His abounding mercy that saves us. It is God’s mercy that brings His blessing into our lives. This is the joy of the Christian’s experience—God’s mercy brings life. Our souls, set free by the work of the Spirit, can now feel the life of Christ pulsating through us, at times, especially when we celebrate in meaningful worship the joy and wonder of the new life that is now ours in Christ Jesus!

But who will receive this crown of life? The New Testament teaches us that it is only those who are faithful to death who will receive the crown of life! True faith cannot be turned on and off like a faucet. A saving relationship with God is not temporary. A disciple of Jesus is called to life-long service. Membership in the Church is a long-term, lasting commitment.



In our spiritual lives we must follow Jesus, first by searching the Scriptures and learning from them the will of God for our lives! In our walk of faith, we must repent of our sins daily through God’s promise first given to us at our Baptisms. We must rejoice in God’s forgiveness, even as we are called upon to receive the True Body and the True Blood of Christ through the Holy Eucharist faithfully for our souls’ salvation.



My prayer for the people of Mt. Olive is that they will remain faithful to Christ and that they will read, study and love the Bible, for it is God’s own letter to us. My prayer for the people of Mt. Olive is that they will worship in our sanctuary each Lord’s Day, rain or shine, vacation time or not. My prayer for the people of Mt. Olive is that they will always be people of prayer and good stewards of all that God entrusts to them of their time, their talents and their treasures.

In Revelation 2:10, we hear our Savior’s promise to each of us:

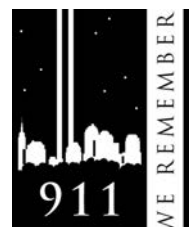

This school year will mark the 12<sup>th</sup> year of the Preschool ministry at Mt. Olive. Teachers arrived back at the preschool on August 28<sup>th</sup> and the school year will kick off with the Parent Meeting on September 4<sup>th</sup>. Many new and returning students will be filling our halls and it is such a privilege to serve the families that have chosen Mt. Olive as their child(ren)'s first school experience!

As a new year begins, I wanted to take the time to thank the current Preschool Board for their willingness to serve: Linda Schmidt, chairperson; Dianne BouFawaz, Johnna Duncan, Phyllis Griesch, treasurer; Jan McCarthy, and Peggy Weed. Their hard work and dedication are such a blessing and they are using their God-given talents to serve Him in such a tangible way.

**Scholarship help is needed:** We currently have a need for 2 full scholarships. These are 2 returning students/families who need a positive educational experience for their child and we are happy to have them join us again in September. The full scholarship amount needed for our three-year-old student is \$1,705 and \$1960 is needed for our 4-year-old student. You can pay this all at once or through monthly installments. Also, as school begins, we are often asked to enroll some other local children who do not qualify for services in the school district, but whose families cannot afford preschool. Please consider sponsoring a child this school year.



**Snacks are needed:** Hungry children mean we will go through a lot of snacks! Please help us fill our shelves. An updated shopping list can be found in the narthex.

I am continually thankful for the blessing of this ministry as an outreach into the community. It stands as a testament to this church's commitment to children and young families. Join me in praying for the staff, board members, children, and families that the Gospel would be spread and that the Lord would be glorified.

There is a small country in Europe named Macedonia. St. Paul traveled there and spread the Good News about Christ our Lord. Many people accepted Jesus as their Savior and several churches were started. Sadly, St. Paul wrote to Christians living in Corinth, Greece, telling about some sort of affliction the Macedonians were suffering. Paul did not say what the trouble was but what impressed Paul was they did not let their troubles kill their joy. In fact, the Macedonians enjoyed being Christians so much that they begged Paul to take a gift of money to use to tell others about salvation.

Paul told the Corinthians about how generous the Macedonians had been. Even though the Macedonians were mostly poor, they had given cheerfully, not begrudgingly. He wanted the Corinthian Christians to know that “God loves a cheerful giver.” Someone may ask, “Does not God love everybody?” The answer is “Yes, of course!” But those who give of themselves readily, cheerfully, generously discover a certain satisfaction, a sense of well-being, they had not known before.

Paul compares what we reap in life to what we sow. If we sow love, good will, and gifts to God meagerly, we will reap meagerly. On the other hand, if we sow love, good will, and gifts to God generously, we will reap bountifully.

As Paul put it to the Corinthians: “God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.”

**Prayer:** Dear Lord, enable each of us to discover the joy which comes from generous giving.” **Amen.**

Parents are welcome to take their small children to the nursery where the worship service can be heard via a speaker. Please remember to tidy up before you leave.



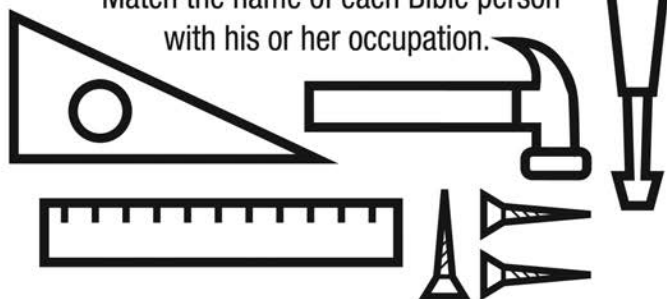
## Secure E Giving

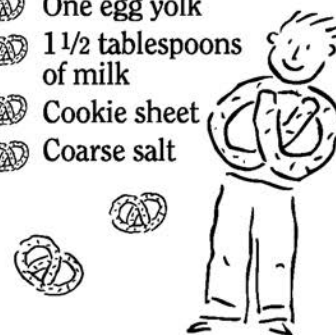

## Make a "Prayer Pretzel"

Pretzels were first made by monks in Rome during the 5th century. The shape looks like a person's arms folded in prayer. You can make your own pretzels.

### You will need:

- A roll of refrigerated bread stick dough
- One egg yolk
- 1 1/2 tablespoons of milk
- Cookie sheet
- Coarse salt



### How to make them:

- Shape each piece of dough into a pretzel shape.
- Place on cookie sheet.
- Brush with a mixture of the egg yolk and milk.
- Sprinkle with salt. (You can use parmesan cheese, if you prefer.)
- Bake according to package directions.
