## FROM PASTOR WALT: MOVING IS HARD!

As I write this, Renee and I are in a hotel in Irmo, and most of our possessions are on a truck somewhere between CT and SC. We got here on a Wednesday; our “stuff” will get here the following Monday.



You know what moving is like. Everything you own goes into boxes, some of it arrives broken, all of it arrives after you’ve slept on the floor for a few days.



Moving is hard. A little known fact: one time Katie Luther said that she wanted to move, and Martin responded with what is called “The second ‘Here I stand’ speech.”

Before leaving Immanuel in Danbury, CT several leaders met with me for an exit interview. If you have ever been to any “Leadership Retreats,” then you know the questions: What are our strengths? What are our growth areas? How can we improve?

They asked one question I hadn’t anticipated. “What words would you leave for your successor?”

Being caught off guard, I thought about it. Three things came to mind:



- 1) Love your people.
- 2) Enjoy your work.
- 3) Don’t neglect your family.

“Love your people,” because Christ did. One speedily says: He has loved His people more than any human pastor ever will. But the people loved by the Savior certainly ought to be loved by the under-shepherd. Quite often they’re really love-able. Sometimes not. Love them anyway. (Truth in advertising: sometimes the pastor isn’t love-able either.)

“Enjoy your work,” because it’s a privilege and a joy to be a pastor. The pastor will hold the newborn infant, hold the hand of a saint in their last hours, and everything in between. (BTW. I love weddings. Know someone getting married? Give me a call.) When you’re called “pastor,” people invite you into the details of their lives. The pastor should get a real charge out of that.

“Don’t neglect your family,” because there is always something else that could be done. The pastor loves what he does. He has also vowed love and faithfulness to a woman who is literally a gift from God. The people of God were called to be faithful spouses, parents, and grandparents. The pastor who models that serves the people well.

So that is what I would say to my successor at Immanuel.

Then it struck me: Wait a minute; I’m starting a new ministry at Mt. Olive. How ought I to go about it? Perhaps the question my leaders asked me created a message for myself.

I am convinced, Renee and I both are convinced, that God Himself has called us to Mt. Olive. We’re very excited to serve among you.

But how to serve? Love your people. Enjoy your work. Don’t neglect your family.

### **BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**



### STEPHEN MINISTRY

***“But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners,  
Christ died for us.” Romans 5:8***

The Stephen Ministry team has recently completed the study of a book, *Pastoral Care under the Cross: God in the Midst of Suffering* by Richard C. Ever, retired, from Concordia University Wisconsin. The book took an in-depth look at caring for people who are in the midst of usual life crises, such as the elderly; those who are mourning, suffering, or near death; and those who are recovering from natural disasters. It also looked at how we as care givers depend on the theology of the cross of Jesus to convey God’s way of caring for us.

The theology of the cross reminds us that through our weakness and suffering, God comes to us most clearly reminding us of the eternal hope that Jesus’ death and resurrection brought to all who believe. In contrast, we looked at the shallow values of our culture that avoid the truth about humanity before God in times of crisis and in death and how they only bring despair and worries.

Thankfully, we have found through the book study that our Stephen Ministry training lines up well with Rev. Ever’s vast experiences in caring: relying on Christ, using Bible passages, listening, reflecting feelings, praying, and focusing on our care receivers. In addition, Stephen Ministry training provides us with role-playing activities where we can practice our skills with each other.

If you are going through one of life’s usual crises or are overwhelmed by your circumstances, and would like to talk with one of our Stephen Ministers, please contact one of our leaders: Bill or Aresa Boykin, Dianne BouFawaz, or Charlie Sandt. Remember that everything you talk about with a Stephen Minister is confidential.

**A Successful Flu Shot Clinic**


