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### An Emphasis for Each Month of the Year

Several years ago I started asking the kids at our Lutheran School to name the major holiday for each month of the year.

Some of the months are obvious. December is Christmas. November is Thanksgiving. Sometimes their answers reflected the thinking of a child. To a child October will always be Halloween, no matter how much the pastor wishes they would say Reformation.

August is the toughie. Nothing comes to mind very quickly. "Vacation" doesn't seem a worthy designation. If you turn to the front of the hymnal it has three liturgical days, none of which really get that much attention by most Christians.

Why bring this up at all? For one thing Ancient Israel had a liturgical calendar. There were days, celebrated every year, that reminded them of God's gracious acts of salvation. They remembered the sparing of Israel's firstborn, the crossing of the Red Sea, the thankfulness owed to God for a plentiful harvest.

The Church of course has such days, but now they reflect the change from the Old to the New Covenant. The birth of the Savior, His resurrection from the dead, and the coming of the Holy Spirit are certainly big ones.

Celebrating such days gives the year a certain rhythm. When it's December we have expectations of what sorts of things will go on around us. For many those expectations turn into excited anticipation. And of course for some there are struggles connected with the season as well.

As someone has pointed out, every year is the same but also different. The sameness is the celebration itself; the differences include such things as: where are we living this year, which loved ones are no longer present with us, or which little newborn is now among us?

So here's what I've come up with.

- January: New Year's Day
- February: Valentine's Day
- March: St. Patrick's Day
- April: Easter (well, most years)
- May: Mother's Day
- June: Father's Day
- July: The Fourth of July
- August: Back to School?
- September: Labor Day
- October: Reformation
- November: Thanksgiving
- December: Christmas



A couple more comments: I chose Reformation Day for October because it's my article, and that's what I keep plugging for. This just in: "Back to School" has been suggested for August!

## **Board of Evangelism: Fishing for the Next Generation of Evangelists**

*And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." Mark 1:17 ESV*



One of the things that all Christians have in common is the practice of sharing their beliefs with the hope of the Holy Spirit bringing others to faith. Last year, a Barna Group survey stated that 96% of practicing Christians believed witnessing for Jesus was part of their faith. However, 47% of the younger generation believed that it was wrong to share one's beliefs with someone of a different faith in hopes that they would, one day, share the same faith. Only 20% of the older generation thought it was wrong.

This indicates a lack of understanding about the practice of evangelism and an overall cultural resistance to conversations that highlight people's differences. Additionally, the study showed that younger generations believe that people today are more likely to be offended by attempts to be converted than they were in the past. This is coupled with the belief that disagreement means judgment, especially with the younger generations.

The president of the Barna Group, David Kinnaman, stated the following:

- Evangelizing others is good and worthy of our time, energy and investment.
- We must pass on resilient faith to Christian young people.
- We must persuade younger Christians that evangelism is an essential practice of following Jesus.
- Evangelism isn't just about saving the unsaved, but reminding ourselves that this stuff matters, that the Bible is trustworthy, and that Jesus changes everything.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sometimes when we are reading, especially Christian literature, certain sentences grab our attention. One example is the following phrase: "God gives to us not to make us thankful but to make us generous and useful to him and others."

### **Please also read II Corinthians 9: 6-15 on "Sowing Generously"**

When something good happens to us, when God seems to be pouring out blessing upon blessing, we are very grateful. And most of us will take time to express our gratitude to God. That is a good response, of course. In less obvious circumstances, however, we often don't express our thankfulness for the many blessings God bestows on us. Thanksgiving follows the realization that all we have was given to us by God. God gives us these things not to make us thankful, but to make us useful! It becomes clear – in fact, it is inescapable – that genuine thankfulness and good stewardship are inseparably related.

What we **express** to God about what He has given to us is called "**Thanksgiving.**" What we **do** with all of our God-given gifts is called "**Stewardship.**" It is to love God with our heart, mind, soul, and strength. After all, is that not the way Christ loves us?

**Prayer:** Gracious God, keep reminding us that we are not only to be grateful to you, but to submit ourselves as faithful stewards on your behalf. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**



### **Men's Prayer Breakfast**



### **Nursery Reminder**





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## A Lenten History Lesson

Though the date of Easter varies, the majority of the Lenten season occurs during March. In fact, the word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon words *lenctentid* (meaning "March") and *lencten* (meaning "spring").

The first reference to Lent dates back to 325 AD, in one of the 20 canons decreed at the Council of Nicaea. By the eighth century, Christians started observing Lent, and a 10th-century monk named Aelfric connected the use of ashes and "the Lenten fast" to the pre-Easter period.

Lent lasts 40 days to represent Jesus' time in the wilderness, when he was tempted by the devil. The six Sundays that occur between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday aren't counted as part of Lent; instead, as the traditional day of worship, they're considered "mini-Easters."

During Lent, God's baptized people cleanse their hearts through practicing the disciplines of repentance, fasting, and almsgiving. Here are 40 ideas for Lent that your family can try. Feel free to substitute similar activities that may work better for you.
