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From Pastor Walt: The Man in Black

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Johnny Cash was one of my favorite saints. Of course, he might not have recognized the word "saint" as being applicable to himself. He once said that he was "the greatest sinner of them all." Saint Paul said much the same thing in First Timothy 1:15: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst."

Cash was born in Arkansas to poor cotton farmers in 1932. He was raised as a Southern Baptist, and was baptized in a river in 1944.

Very often when we talk about a Christian we do what I just did: We give the date of their birth, and the date of their baptism. Important milestones, of course. But the rest of life follows on from there, doesn't it?

Cash was in the United States Air Force for four years. Even there he formed a country band. When he got out he went right back to music.

Like anyone else, it started slowly, but through hard work and determination he kept at it. A hit here, and a hit there, and pretty soon he was switching from a minor record label to Columbia Records. In 1969 he outsold the Beatles!

He'd tell us that he was an "imperfect" saint. But is there any other kind? Some of us are more effective at covering up the imperfections, but we're all depending on Grace.

Cash was not good at covering it up. There was abuse of alcohol and drugs, unfaithfulness in his first marriage, and a divorce in 1966. Those are the things that most people don't look for in your next pastor or Sunday School teacher. Johnny Cash was neither of those things, so he kept at it.

He spent a night in jail seven times. All misdemeanor charges, he was never jailed longer than overnight. His famous concerts in prisons make people think that he was one of the inmates, but he wasn't. He certainly had a connection with the "guests of the state." Two great live albums come from those concerts; Johnny Cash at Folsom Prison, and Johnny Cash at San Quentin.

In 1970 Cash rediscovered his faith, and responded to an altar call at an Assembly of God church. He also got off the drugs, which June Carter Cash required him to do. (The encouragement of a good strong spouse can have many positive effects, agreed?)

Alas, after seven years of sobriety, Cash returned to drugs in 1977. In 1983 he went to the Betty Ford Clinic. A few years later he relapsed again, and went to a clinic in Nashville, TN. He was again clean for a while, relapsed again, and then went to a clinic in Loma Linda, CA in 1992. This time he stayed clean, but what a roller-coaster ride!

Cash was an advocate for Native Americans, and was adopted by the Seneca Nation.

He sang often at Billy Graham rallies.

He became a student of the Bible, and narrated an audiotope of the New Testament (KJV, of course). He also wrote a book about Jesus titled, "The Man in White."

Cash was a cross-over artist, moving well beyond his start in Country Music. He's in three music Halls of Fame: for Country Music, Rock and Roll, and Gospel.

Late in his life he began recording the "American" album series. One of my favorite things he ever did was "American IV: The Man Comes Round."

There are two great songs from that album that you ought to check out on YouTube. First is a re-make of the song "Hurt," originally recorded by industrial band Nine Inch Nails. The video is full of Cash's biography, the drugs, the success, the hardships, his faith in Christ. It's nearly impossible to get through it without tearing up. The video won a Grammy.

The other is "The Man Comes Round." Cash didn't make a video for it (that I know of), but look for the version that has the lyrics. Cash said he spent months on this song writing, editing, and re-editing. It's a powerful song about the return of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Johnny Cash died on September 12, 2003. He was an imperfect saint, but a man who knew the depths of Grace because he'd known the depths of the mire. I hope you enjoy his art. Listen to him knowing that he is a brother in Christ, and we will see him in heaven.

Stephen Ministries St. Louis has been proactive in connecting with their congregations throughout these weeks of isolation. They know that people continue to go through crises and may have extended needs. Last week, they sent out *Eight Tips for Stephen Ministers' Care during Social Distancing*. These tips are good reminders for all of us as we check in with our friends.

1. **Be Intentional** to call and check in with folks.
2. **Use Voice or Video – Not Text** as much as possible. Phone and video calls, where you can hear each other in real time, are better than texts or emails.
3. **Be Aware of Communication Limitations** such as dropped calls and privacy issues.
4. **Be Fully Present** by giving the other person your undivided attention.
5. **Listen Actively** meaning that you pay close attention to not only words, but to the tone of voice, pauses, and other nonverbal cues.
6. **Explore and Validate Feelings of Grief**, especially when it is related to the current crisis. Assure the person that it is OK to feel this way, and let him/her talk more.
7. **Pray for or with Your Friends** either on the phone or later. The power of prayer is a tremendous source of comfort.
8. **Take Care of Yourself** physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Remain in God's Word daily and if you feel you need care, please call one of our Stephen Ministers or Pr. Walt.

Remember that everything told to Pastor or a Stephen Minister is confidential.

The commentary provides historical insight to what is happening and may explain an original Greek or Hebrew word and how it was used.
