From Pastor Walt: Two Things You've Supported

This month I'd like to focus on two ministries which Mt. Olive supports. They are:

The Nazarene Fund



We've all seen the horrific images coming from Afghanistan. Of course the church newsletter is not about to start debating the politics of any of this. But we do focus on the human tragedy of it, and wonder:



What can we possibly do?

Our first and natural reaction is to assume that there's nothing that can be done. In this case, I'm happy to say that Dana Magic, our Church Treasurer, called to say that she'd heard of the efforts of the Nazarene Fund to get people out of Afghanistan, and could we support it?


Their mission statement is: "To liberate the captive, to free the enslaved, and to rescue, rebuild and restore the lives of Christians and other persecuted religious and ethnic minorities wherever and whenever they are in need."

To that end the Fund has relocated people from places of persecution, or in other cases has rebuilt towns, schools, and even religious sites.

In the case of Afghanistan, they've said that it would take around \$4,000 to get one person out of the calamity happening there. Given that a need for a quick response was necessary, Treasurer Magic proposed that we send \$4,000 to the Nazarene Fund, which we have done.

Her next thought was: I wish we could do more. But we are one part of what will undoubtedly be a much larger response from the Christian Church throughout the country. The reports on their efforts are so far encouraging.

The Gideons International



You know them as the people who place Bibles in hotels. Of course that's part of their mission, but the Gideons print and distribute Bibles much more widely then that. They give them out to college students, send them along with our troops, place them in prisons, and leave them at nursing homes.

The Gideons are inter-denominational, which means that Baptists, Methodists, Lutherans, and others, are involved. There may be some specific differences between these Christians. But the mission of the Gideons is one we can whole-heartedly support: Get the Word of God out!


I'll never forget that when I was a college student the Gideons came to give out, for free, a little New Testament and Psalms. It was in the New King James Version, which is one of my favorites. And it's so small that it easily fits in a pocket. They gave me that "Pocket Testament" (as they often call it) in 1980 or 1981. I still carry it around with me. It's in my car, and is my Bible for hospital and home visits.

To support this important mission two brothers from the Gideons came and spoke briefly at all three weekend services on the weekend of August 21st-22nd.

I'm happy to say that when we took a "door offering" for this ministry people gave \$747.

The modern world is getting pretty nearly overwhelming. Talking to believers, I sense the feeling that the "problems are so big that there's nothing we can do." As the Gideons always remind us: The first thing is to pray. They're right about that.

And having prayed, it makes good sense for us to turn our support into very practical support. As a congregation you do this very well. So I wanted to share that in August of 2021 here were two ways you have done so again.

The following blurb was posted on Instagram in late July by columbiatherapyonline. Even though Stephen Ministers are NOT counselors or therapists, these words ring true:

"Grief comes in many forms and can result from any number of events: The passing of a loved one, the loss of a relationship or a job, moving to a new location, or even the letting go of a dream that no longer seems possible or appropriate. Any type of transition or change in life can involve significant loss and therefore, grief. If you are struggling to make sense of your life as the result of a loss or major change, you are not alone. Finding joy and finding meaning in life as you continue the grieving process is possible. The pain won't necessarily be taken away. You will simply grow and expand to allow room for things like laughter, enjoyment, passion, and love. These things will exist alongside your grief because you will learn to create space within you for all of it. Your grief will no longer consume and dominate you. It will simply remain part of the rich tapestry that IS you."

The Season after Pentecost Sign of the Month

It's September and the church is half way into its longest season, The Season after Pentecost. Watch for the Year B September sign at the entrance to the church. During year B of the church calendar, the Gospel scriptures generally come from Mark and in September, they will be from chapters 7 and 9. The first two weeks recount Jesus healing a deaf and

mute man and a boy with an impure spirit. The third week, Jesus again predicts His death a second time. The fourth week, Jesus warns the disciples about being careful to not cause other believers to stumble.

Here is the preview of the September sign. As you come into the church why not take the ramp and pause a few moments by the sign to pick out the key words from each week's Gospel. Here is a little hint to help you out: the words on the signs are color coded by week! If you follow Mt. Olive on social media (mtolivesc) you will have seen posts of the weekly lectionary readings, so you can always use your smart phone to help you in your search.


Nursery "Cry Room" Reminder




