From Pastor Walt: Sermon Series for Lent Midweek Services

"Visited by Prophets"

Last Advent we had a sermon series for the Midweek Services. It was called, "Visited by Angels," based on the prevalence of angels in the run-up to Christmas.



Angels, it was noted, are God's non-corporeal messengers, always active, but uniquely so in anticipation of the birth of the Savior.

So this Lent we'll look not at "angels" in that sense, but the "other messengers from God," His holy prophets.

You can't get far into the Old Testament before you start bumping into these guys. There are many of them, and they span many centuries of work.

Unlike angels, they are quite corporeal. They're human, limited, fallen, imperfect, full of hopes and dreams, as well as frustrations. Sometimes they're powerful, often they're full of doubts and hesitation. (You will regularly see them saying something along the lines of: "Send someone else," or even "Are You sure You want to send me?")

Still, off they went. They preached the words God gave them. They called their own people to repentance. And of course they preached that someday God would do something special through the Messiah.

We can't look at them all in the few weeks of Lent. But we can look at some of them, and we will. Here's the plan:

March 2: Intro to the Prophets

March 9: Elijah
March 16: Isaiah
March 23: Jeremiah
March 30: Ezekiel
April 6: Daniel



I hope that you'll consider joining us for either the 12:00 (noon) service, or the 7:00 pm service.

The Board of Public Relations: A Prayer for Lent

This year, Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, falls on March 2nd. During worship services that day, pastors in many Christian churches dip a finger in ashes (often made by burning branches from the previous Palm Sunday) and make crosses on parishioners' foreheads.

Why ashes? Traditionally, they are a sign of mourning, humiliation, and penitence. Ashes also represent the frailty and temporary nature of human life ("You are dust, and to dust you shall return," Genesis 3:19). Christians are pained because our sins led to Jesus' death. With repentant hearts, we begin the season of Lent, knowing that it leads to Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday.

For Ash Wednesday — and throughout the 40 days of Lent — ponder this prayer from an Italian sacramentary, or liturgical book: "O God, you know how fragile is our human nature, wounded as it is by sin. Help your people to enter upon the Lenten journey strengthened by the power of your Word, so that we may be victorious over the seduction of the Evil One and reach the paschal feast in the joy of the Holy Spirit."

On March 2nd, we will enter the season of Lent, a season for remembering and focusing on the passion of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The cross of Christ has always been God the Father's only plan to save fallen and sinful mankind. As early as **Genesis 3:15** God promised that a redeemer born of a virgin would crush the serpent's head: "And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her seed; He shall bruise you on the head, And you shall bruise him on the heel." And Psalm 22 and Isaiah 53

vividly describe His crucifixion and the reason for it. Jesus' 4th word from the cross was Psalm 22:1a: "My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken me?" Psalm 22:16-18 vividly describes his crucifixion: "For dogs have surrounded me; A band of evildoers have encompassed me; They pierced my hands and my feet. I can count all my bones, They look, they stare at me; They divide my garments among them, And for my clothing they cast lots." And Isaiah 53:5-6 states the reason for His passion: "But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed. All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the LORD has caused the iniquity of us all To fall on Him."

This Lenten season lets us be in church on Sundays and on Wednesdays, in Sunday Bible class, and in Bible study and prayer daily. Let us give generously of our time, efforts, and resources to spread the Gospel of Christ crucified for our sins and raised for our justification. And let us reach out to unbelieving and unchurched family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers.

The Board of Evangelism: Mission Restrictions

A news article in Christianity Today tells of a man in southeastern Russia who was fined the equivalent of \$80 USD for handing out tracts that read, "You must be born again!" In South Korea a man met with 10 friends in a private home to talk about the Good News of Jesus Christ, and he was fined the equivalent of \$400 USD. Several countries have restrictions on religious activity by foreigners who are only visiting. In some countries, foreigners who participate in religious activities other than those that are state approved, can be classified as extremists and terrorists. These are just a few examples of the restrictions and persecutions of Christians around the world.

The United States Commission on International Religious Freedom has recommended sanctions in response to violations of religious liberty. But what can we as individual Christians do? Support Lutheran missionary efforts financially and prayerfully.

There is a daily devotional for Leviticus on You Version by Spoken Gospel entitled "Jesus in All of Leviticus." So far, it has been helpful in explaining how everything in Leviticus points to Jesus! Why not try a new approach to help you with reading the harder books.

The last half of March, we will move on to Revelation. This is another confusing book filled with imagery of past, present, and future visions given to John the Apostle. Again, you may want to supplement your reading with your Lutheran Study Bible commentary or one of the above apps.
