From Pastor Walt: The Season of Easter = the Life of the Church

You've heard the old saw, "Easter is a Season, and not just a Day." And so it is. On Easter Sunday the Church celebrates the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

But that one day was followed by 40 days of His presence with His disciples. Many eyewitnesses saw Him and heard Him. That period of time before His ascension into heaven gives us the Season of Easter.



In Church, the First Lesson throughout the Season always comes from the Book of Acts. There are three years of appointed readings; this is true for all three years.

Why? Because the life, the death, and the resurrection of Jesus brings about the Life of the Church.

Acts is a great book, and is really unique in the Bible. The Gospels describe the life and ministry of Jesus. The Epistles explain what it all means. Revelation is the one book of prophecy in the New Testament (making it unique, too). But the Book of Acts describes the beginning of the Church, the spread of the Gospel, and the ministry of those early disciples.

Acts was written by Luke, "the beloved physician." (Col. 4:14) He also wrote the Gospel of Luke, which in Acts he refers to as "my former book." Although Luke wrote only those two books, the two of them together make up 26% of the NT!

So what's in Acts? A record of God's rather imperfect people, doing ministry in the name of Jesus. It's a delight to read.

People come to faith.

The Gospel goes out from Israel, to include the Gentiles.

Miracles are done in the name of Jesus.

And then the people of the Church bicker with one another, and argue about things that don't matter, and have personal rivalries, etc.

In a way it's encouraging. Jesus is the Savior. We are human, and prove it often. Despite the second of those truths, the Spirit of God is at work, and the message goes out.

So read a bit through this wonderful portion of Scripture.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! And either with us, or despite us, that Good News continues to make a difference in the lives of broken, but redeemed, people.

I found out that we consisted of a Catholic and three Lutherans (WELS, ELCA and LCMS). I realized then that we did not know each other's religion until someone started first. Are there people with whom you have close contact but do not know their religious preferences? Be on the lookout for a chance to bring up the subject and act on it.

As I was thinking about this month's article two items from the airwaves in the first decade of the 21st century came to my mind. **Lutheran Hour** speaker Ken Klaus preached a sermon on the Feeding of the 5000. He talked about how Jesus hid Himself from the crowds after the feeding, because they wanted to make Him an earthly king. Klaus stated that Jesus came to bear the sins of humanity on the cross and win an eternal heavenly kingdom for many, **not** to create a temporary second-rate "heaven" on Earth. And the pastor of a local independent congregation in Columbia, Det Bowers, frequently ran a TV ad in which he stated "There is no earthly eternity" and concluded by asking "Do you know the Son of God?".

And now some Bible verses:

"Brethren, join in following my example, and observe those who walk according to the pattern you have in us. For many walk, of whom I often told you, and now tell you even weeping, that they are enemies of the cross of Christ, whose end is destruction, whose god is their appetite, and whose glory is in their shame, who set their minds on earthly things. 




Thoughts, Prayers, Calls, & Cards

The Season of Easter Signs



We in the Lutheran Church are fortunate to celebrate the season of Easter for six weeks! Therefore, we will get accustomed to seeing the Easter sign out front. The sign will remind us of the most important event in history: the day Jesus Christ arose from the dead, insuring eternal life with Him in heaven to all who believe!

On the last Sunday of May, we will celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven where He sits at the right hand of God the Father. Luke tells us in his Gospel account that first,

Jesus opened the minds of the apostles so that they understood all of His teachings and He sent them out, beginning in Jerusalem, to bear witness to these things. After they watched Jesus ascend, they were joyful and worshiped continually!





10 Extraordinary Mothers of the Bible

1. Sarah: The Mother Who Waited

Sarah was married to Abraham and God told them that their offspring would be more than the stars in the sky. In Genesis 11:30 we learn, "*Now Sarai was childless because she was not able to conceive*." Abraham and Sarah waited 15 years before God renewed His promise, and 10 more years before the promise was fulfilled and Sarah bore a son, Isaac.

2. Hagar: The Mother Who Endured

Hagar was Sarah's Egyptian slave that Sarah gave to Abraham to have a child, because she couldn't have. Once Hagar became pregnant with Abraham's child, a rift developed between her and Sarah. After receiving mistreatment from Sarah, Hagar fled toward her homeland. But she met the angel of the LORD who told her to return, He also promised her numerous descendants through her son whom she was to name Ishmael.

Later, Hagar and her son Ishmael were sent away into the desert, where she believed they would both die. But God is faithful and showed her a well. Genesis 21 tells us, "God was with the boy as he grew up. He lived in the desert and became an archer."

3. Rebekah: The Mother Who Believed

Rebekah was married to Issac. Genesis 25 tells us that when Rebekah became pregnant she could feel two babies jostling within her. When she asked the LORD why this was happening, He answered her: "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you will be separated; one people will be stronger than the other, and the older will serve the younger." In that time, the older would have never served the younger, and the firstborn son would have inherited the best of everything.

Rebekah risked deception to follow God's promise because she believed what He said was true. It should be noted that God did not call Rebekah to deception, but God is sovereign despite the good or bad choices we may make. And His plan unfolded exactly as He had told her. Later her son Jacob would wrestle with God and be given a new name, Israel.

4. Leah and Rachel: The Mothers Who Had to Share

When Jacob went to stay with his uncle Laban, he met one of his daughters, Rachel, and loved her. He wanted her for his wife and was willing to work seven years to marry her. But Laban tricked Jacob by giving him his older daughter Leah in marriage instead. Jacob worked another seven years for Rachel, and he loved her more. Leah, knowing that she was unloved, bore Jacob many children to please him, while Rachel remained barren.

Genesis 30 tells us, "Then God remembered Rachel; he listened to her and enabled her to conceive." Rachel bore Jacob two sons, Joseph and Benjamin, before she died in childbirth with Benjamin.

God blessed both Leah and Rachel with children, continuing his covenant promise with Abraham. Leah and Rachel's sons would go on to form the 12 tribes of Israel.

5. Jochebed: The Mother with a Plan

A Levite woman, Jochebed, gave birth to a son, Moses, and hid him for 3 months. Exodus 2 tells us that the Pharaoh's daughter pulled his papyrus basket from the Nile and raised him in Pharaoh's palace.

Jochebed was determined to find a way to save her son, and God blessed her plan. Not only was her son saved from death, she was able to nurse and raise him until he was old enough to go live with Pharaoh's daughter. Her son, Moses, went on to free the Hebrew people from Egypt, leading them in the desert toward the Promised Land according to God's plan.

6. Samson's Mother: The Mother Who Followed the Rules

She is not mentioned by name in the Book of Judges, but her husband's name was Manoah. She wasn't able to conceive but Judges 13 tells us, "The angel of the LORD appeared to her and said, 'You are barren and childless, but you are going to become pregnant and give birth to a son. Now see to it that you drink no wine or other fermented drink and that you do not eat anything unclean. You will become pregnant and have a son whose head is never to be touched by a razor because the boy is to be a Nazirite dedicated to God from the womb. He will take the lead in delivering Israel from the hands of the Philistines.'"

She gave birth and named the baby Samson, and the LORD blessed him. Although some of his actions were questionable, the LORD used him mightily in His plan to defeat the Philistines.

7. Naomi: The Mother-in-Law Who Shared Her Faith

Naomi was a Judean living in Moab when her husband died. Her daughter in law, Ruth, went with Naomi back to her homeland. After learning about Naomi's faith, and listening to Naomi's instructions, Ruth married Boaz. They had a child named Obed, the father of Jesse, the father of David who would be king. -Ruth 4:17.

8. Hannah: The Mother Who Kept Her Promise

Hannah was married to a man who loved her very much, but he also had another wife. This wife was able to bear children, but we learn that the LORD had closed Hannah's womb. The rival wife provoked Hannah continually, but Hannah would go to the house of the LORD to pray. Hannah prayed to the LORD and wept bitterly; she prayed so hard that her lips were moving but no sound came out so that the priest, Eli, thought she was drunk. The LORD blessed Hannah, and she gave birth to a son and named him Samuel, "saying, 'Because I asked the LORD for him.'"

She promised to give her son to the LORD and when the boy was old enough she took him to the house of the LORD and presented him to Eli.

Samuel lived a life dedicated to the LORD, and he would go on to lead the people of Israel, anointing Israel's first and second kings—Saul and David.

9. Elizabeth: The Mother Who Believed in Miracles

Elizabeth was married to a priest named Zechariah, both beyond child bearing years. When Zechariah was serving in the temple, an angel of the Lord, Gabriel, approached him and told him that they were going to have a child, but Zechariah doubted him and was struck mute for the durations of Elizabeth's pregnancy.

When it came time for Elizabeth to give birth, she named her son John. When neighbors went to confirm this with Zechariah he wrote the same name and his mouth was opened; everyone wondered at what the child would be since his birth was miraculous.

John would go on to baptize people from their sins with water. He would prepare the way for the Messiah.

10. Mary: The Mother Who is Blessed among Women

Mary, a virgin pledged to a man named Joseph, was also visited by the angel Gabriel. He said that she was to have a son, and His name is to be Jesus. Even though she wondered how all this was going to happen, she believed and bore the Son of God. Mary treasured up many things in her heart as she raised Jesus, but she also had to endure the greatest sacrifice of all time—her son was the Son of God and He had come to give Himself up as a sacrifice, the one and only sacrifice that could be made for mankind. She had to watch Him suffer, be tortured and mocked, and die a cruel death on a cross by crucifixion.
