#### From Pastor Walt: National Youth Gathering

So another National Youth Gathering has happened. 20,000 high schoolers and their adult chaperones gather in one major city, and have a five-day youth conference. This year we were in Houston, TX. Hot, but a great city to visit.



It has to be in a major city, because the Gathering will occupy a couple dozen hotels, and need one major Convention Center and one major Sports Arena. The Convention Center will need break-out rooms for various speakers; it will need to have large-scale food operations, and it needs space for games and activities, as well as a display room for all the organizations that want to bring a presentation to the Gathering.

The Sports Arena will hold the "mass events," when everyone is in the same place at the same time. Just like any sporting event, getting 20,000 people into and out of a building is in itself a logistical exercise. Getting them back to their hotels at the end of the event is another logistical exercise (which this year didn't always flow quite as smoothly as it should have).

There's always a "house band," that leads worship. There's also a "headliner band," that's more well-known. I have to admit that, given my age, I didn't know either band. (Sheepish smile.)

In the old days there was a Communion Service early in the Gathering; often on a Sunday, because, well, it's Sunday. This year the Communion Service was the very last event, and closed out the Gathering. When I first saw the schedule I wasn't sure that I'd like that, but once we did it that way I really liked the change. Synodical President Matt Harrison preached, and 20,000 of us had the Sacrament together, before being on our ways back home.

One fun part of the Gathering is that our kids get to see how Midwestern the Synod really is. Every day you meet hundreds of people, often asking, "Where are you from?" So our kids got to hear from people from Minnesota, Michigan, Missouri, Ohio, and Iowa quite a lot. They also got to see the surprised look on the face of the Midwesterners when we said "South Carolina." "There are Lutherans out there?" was all over their faces.

So there are skits (sometimes silly, sometimes pretty good), there are speakers (I liked them a lot this year), and there are all those participants. The Big Message of the Gathering is that you are not alone in your faith walk.

Like any family trip, there was a lot of fun. There was some waiting in lines. There were a couple moments of tiredness and getting short with one another. Put it all together and it's really quite nice.

A word of thanks to Mt. Olive: Your support for this event, as is typical of our congregation, was generous and helpful.

All in all, another successful Gathering. A lot of fun. We're all exhausted. And it's not all bad that they only happen every three years. In 2025, we'll see everybody in New Orleans.




#### From our President:

should be (yet another) wake-up call to Christians—this world is not our home!".



The **Luther Rose** was designed in 1516 by Martin Luther, who said that it set forth the basic elements of Christian theology.

The black cross on a red heart reminds us that the crucified Christ saves us. The background of the rose is sky blue to show that this joy in the Spirit and in faith is the beginning of the heavenly joy to come. It is surrounded by a golden ring, to signify that the bliss of heaven is endless and lasts forever, and is more precious than all other joys and treasures.


