From Pastor Walt: Thanksgiving and Voting

So November means two different things, and they are very un-alike. One of them is Thanksgiving, which means food, family, football, and remembering to thank God for His many blessings.

The other is Election Day, which means a free people selecting their leaders. Of course stated like that, it sounds very good. At the same time, we know the reality of the political division and the spirit of contention that exists in our country.





I strongly encourage Christians to be involved in both Thanksgiving and Voting! The Bible is clear that our God has saved us (most importantly), and also blesses us in many earthy, practical ways (less important than eternal life, but still very significant).

So, gather with family and friends. Enjoy the fellowship, and the food. And remember to spend some time in prayer to our gracious God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Just as strongly I urge everyone: Go vote! The pastor should never tell you how to vote; but he should always urge you to go and cast your vote. It's a rare privilege (in Human History), and really a responsibility.

So, does the Bible say anything about Christians and Government? Yes, more than can be put into one article. But here are some samples:

Psalm 72:1, "Endow the king with Your justice. O God." I.e., Christians pray for their leaders. Even if I didn't vote for this particular one, I still pray that God's ways be known and affirmed.

Proverbs 28:2, "When a country is rebellious, it has many rulers." That is, most of the time, most of the people are law-abiding. But if the people themselves become less and less lawful, they will be governed by an ever-growing Government presence. As a corollary, part of being a Christian is what used to be called "citizenship."

Nehemiah 2:2, "...so the king asked me, 'Why does your face look so sad when you are not ill? This can be nothing but sadness of heart." In this passage Nehemiah has received terrible news about the conditions in Israel, which makes him sullen, which is

noticed by the pagan king Artaxerxes. Maybe this verse seems like a small thing; but it's great to be led by perceptive and compassionate leaders.

Acts 26:2-3, "King Agrippa, I consider myself fortunate to stand before you today as I make my defense against all the accusations of the Jews, and especially so because you are well acquainted with all the Jewish customs and controversies. Therefore, I beg you to listen to me patiently." This is a wonderful case of St. Paul, first of all, using his legal rights to defend himself, and then secondly, also addressing the person in authority with a respectful and appropriate tone.

In Romans 13:1-7 we're told that God desires Good Government; that Christians are generally obedient toward it, and that the Government exists to punish the wicked and to reward the righteous. The passage of course also implies that Government has a responsibility to do exactly that; and that when it doesn't, it isn't holding up its end of the bargain.

Acts 5:29, "We must obey God rather than men." This is Peter and other disciples on trial for preaching the Gospel. The Government has told them to stop preaching, and they correctly respond that the Government generally has our obedience, but it does not have the right to tell us to stop practicing our Faith.

And finally, I'll put this here, to demonstrate that it matters very much that Christians vote on the basis of Values and Worldview:

Proverbs 29:2
"When the righteous thrive, the people rejoice;
When the wicked rule, the people groan."

And so many desperately need to hear the call to come to Calvary's holy mountain like it says in the LSB 435 verse 4 for:

Signed when our Redeemer died,
Sealed when He was glorified."

1 John 5:11-12 states; "And the witness is this, that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life."

Let us be in church weekly, in prayer and Bible study daily and in Bible class when possible. Let us support this church with our time, effort and resources. Let us reach out to unbelieving and unchurched family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, etc.


Veterans in our Congregation will be honored before/after the worship services on November 12th & 13th.



The Board of Trustees: Up Date on Projects

The Trustees have been busy working on the church over the past few months.

We have repaired a leaking toilet, replaced the faucet in the main sink in the kitchen, and repaired a p-trap in the nursery restrooms. This work was performed by our trustee, James Sharpe. Thank you for all of your help with this, James!

Repairs have been completed on our detention pond, which is located beside the playground. We have performed the following work:

- Removed sediment from the bottom of the pond.
- Stabilized one of the eroded embankment walls by:
 - Installed a geotextile fabric to control erosion.
 - Placed rye grass seed over the fabric, which will serve to keep the fabric in place as the grass grows over it.
- Added rip-rap (rocks) to the pond inlet flume, where water from the parking lot drains into the pond.
- Mowed the bottom of the pond.

The detention pond work was performed by our trustee, Mike Prater, for less than \$1,000. If an outside company had been hired, it would have cost between \$4,000 and \$6,000. Thank you for all of your help with this, Mike!

Several of our members have been trained on the new Audio/Video (AV) Equipment. We are currently forming an AV Team to record our church services for our homebound and out-of-town members to view online. If you are interested in serving on the AV Team, please email me at trustees@mtolivesc.org. More volunteers are needed and anyone willing to learn will be welcome!




Read the Bible in Three Years - November 2022







media (mtolivesc) you will have read weekly posts of the lectionary readings, so you can always use your smart phone to help you in your search.






Secure E Giving Reminder
