From Pastor Walt: The Bible is About Jesus

- Eve was told that the "seed of the woman" would defeat Satan.
- Samson died standing in the shape of a cross.
- David defeated Goliath just outside the town of Bethlehem.

These are some of the Old Testament passages we've been looking at in the Midweek Services this year. These are Historical Narratives, and took place in space and time. But at the same time they were pointing to what God would do in Christ to save us.



The Old Testament is full of such things:

- God asked Abraham to offer his "only son," and also gave him back to Abraham.
- Israel went through the waters of the Red Sea and so were "baptized into Moses."
- Countless lambs, spotless males, were offered for the sins of the people.
- After David's sin with Bathsheba the un-named "son of David" died for the sins of others.
- And this: Jonah was in the belly of the whale for three days.

How many such passages are there? The more you read, the more you find them. Again, this is not to make the Old Testament an allegory. It's just that we notice God has sent the message over and over again.

This spring, like every other spring, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. You've heard it many times, of course. But we never tire of hearing it: Christ died for your sins, then rose for your victory.

Prophets sometimes said it directly (Is. 7:14), and sometimes in more subtle ways. And then there are those places where the Old Testament narrative itself is a depiction of what Christ will do.

I've always thought that this is why St. Paul became an overnight Christian evangelist. He knew his Old Testament very well. But he didn't initially see that it was about Christ, and so he opposed the new Christian faith.

After the miraculous encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus he suddenly had a 180 degree shift in the way he read the Old Testament Scriptures. He had once read it as History. He now saw it as being fulfilled in Christ.

Any Christian of course starts out there: the Bible is about Jesus. But New Testament Christians will often have fun finding all those ancient texts that either directly, or sometimes only as a whisper, refer to what Christ would do.

Christ was crucified; Christ is risen; Christ is coming again.

This brings to mind the last two verses of my favorite Easter hymn "He's risen, He's risen, Christ Jesus the Lord", words and music by C. F. W. Walther, translation from LW 138.



"Oh where is your sting, death? We fear you no more, Christ rose, and now open is fair Eden's door. For all our transgressions his blood does atone; Redeemed and forgiven, we now are his own. "Then sing your hosannas and raise your loud voice; Proclaim the blest tidings that all may rejoice. Laud, honor and praise to the Lamb that was slain, In glory he reigns, yes, and ever shall reign."

The Board of Public Relations: Passover & Easter

The Passover and Easter have many things in common and are celebrated about the same time each year. The first Passover happened when the Israelites were living in Egypt. God saved the Israelites from slavery by sending Moses to deliver them. Similarly, God saved mankind from sin and death by sending His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross, rise from the dead, thus giving all who believe eternal life with Him in heaven.

On the first Passover, God instructed Moses to have each of the Israelite families place the blood of an unblemished lamb on the door posts of their homes to show the angel of death to "pass over" and not kill their first-born sons. This act points to Jesus who became the sacrificial lamb for the world, saving us from sin, death, and the devil.

Moses told the Israelites to roast the lamb and eat it with unleavened bread. They were to be fully nourished and clothed, and ready to go because they did not know the hour when Pharaoh would let them go. As Jesus was celebrating the last Passover before His death, He instituted the familiar words, "This is my body" and "This is my blood," showing Himself to be the true Passover lamb. As believers, Jesus taught us to continue to "be ready" for His return by faithful study of His Word, participation in worship, and receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion. God is the only One who knows when that time will be!
