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From Our Pastor: "The More Things Change..."

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I love these lists you can find on the internet comparing the modern world to former times. Here are some fun things to know:

In the United States, in the year 1900:

- Average life expectancy was 48
- Half of all Americans lived in poverty
- 28% of teenagers attended high school (the rest worked the farm, or in a factory)
- 1% of households owned a car (no Model T yet)
- 8% of homes had a telephone
- 3% of homes had electricity
- 1/3 of Americans had running water in their home
- 15% of homes had an in-door flush toilet
- Given all of that, the U.S. was the wealthiest nation on earth!



By comparison, in the United States, in the year 2020:

- The average grocery store has 42,000 items
- There are 1.88 vehicles per household, and 1/3 had 3 or more cars
- The average single family home is 2,300 square feet
- 99% of new cars are sold with air conditioning
- The average home receives 189 television channels (and there's still nothing worth watching)
- 75% of homes have a dishwasher (and 1/3 of them do not use it – huh?)
- 89% of homes have AC, and in the South it's 99%
- 96% of adult Americans have a cell phone
- 85% of homes have an internet connection



So why is this in the pastor's newsletter article? First of all because it's fun. But secondly to make us think and wonder a bit. What does it mean to the church that these changes have come?

Some things don't change. Come to think of it, quite a lot of things in life don't change. There will always be joys and sorrows, there will always be new babies, and illness and mortality.

Certainly the truth of the Gospel does not change. For every culture, place and time the Good News is that Christ has died to reconcile sinners to God. And the mission of the

church will always, always be to get that message out, and then to nurture and grow those who have come to faith.



Here are some thoughts to build upon as we shift gears after the summer break to help us stay focused as we resume fall schedules at church, work, and home.

- 1) **Decide what you want to do, but always consult with God first.** 'Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails' (Proverbs 19:21).
- 2) **Write your thoughts down on paper.** Writing goals down gives them a sense of permanency with potential for the energy to get them done.
- 3) **Establish a deadline.** Without a definite beginning and ending it's easy to procrastinate and get nowhere.
- 4) **Make a list of what you need to do.** Keep it before you at all times; it will help you remain focused. Lack of decisiveness and objectives won't get you where you want to go.
- 5) **Convert your list to a plan.** Decide what you need to do first and what you can do later. An organized written plan with a timeline is always better than thoughts in your head.
- 6) **Act! Do something!** A mediocre plan that's implemented beats a brilliant one that never happens. Make the most of every opportunity, but be cautious and wise.
- 7) **Do something every day to move you forward.** Build it into your schedule; e.g.: Like our daily Bible scripture readings, catching up on an unfinished project a little each day, engaging in physical activity daily, and...
- 8) **Have a goal you're willing to devote your time and talents to.** Stay focused on the end goal.

Setting goals helps us accomplish more than we thought possible, but the thing that should matter to you most is doing God's will. 'Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom' (Psalm 90:12).

"And brother will deliver up brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents, and cause them to be put to death. And you will be hated by all on account of My name, but it is the one who has endured to the end who will be saved."

Matthew 10:21-22

The excerpts below are quoted from President Matthew Harrison's article "Christ Crucified" in the April, 2023 issue of *The Lutheran Witness*: "the national debate went from whether or not states would allow same-sex marriage to the imposition of the same by the Supreme Court. Then things turned immediately and forcefully to the transgender issues, prepubescent sex change procedures and all related matters." ... "But now," ... "the entire government has put its full force against natural law and the biblical teaching of sex and marriage."

I received a letter in the mail last December from Ken Ham of *Answers in Genesis*. It showed a survey finding that only 8.72% of Americans ages 18-34 attend church on a weekly basis. We are truly living in a dark time. Jesus told us not to be surprised by this. Paul reminded Timothy: ***"And indeed, all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."*** 2 Timothy 3:12

The time may be coming soon when the cost of following Christ might involve severe hardship and difficulty in this world. May we be willing to pay that price. ***"We have an altar, from which those who serve the tabernacle have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy place as an offering for sin, are burned outside the camp. Therefore, Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people through His own blood, suffered outside the gate. Hence, let us go out to Him outside the camp, bearing His reproach. For here we do not have a lasting city, but we are seeking the city which is to come."*** Hebrews 13:10-14

So, let us trust in Christ alone for salvation, and let us trust in Him to provide for us in this life. And let us be in church whenever possible; involved in Bible study; in prayer for yourself, family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, and this church, and the church at large. Reach out to family, friends, neighbors, and coworkers with the Gospel of Christ crucified for our sins and raised for our justification. Generously support this church with your time, talents, and resources.

In August, we began to read the book of Numbers and continue reading it the first three weeks of September. As we begin the month in chapter 13, Moses sends a few spies into the land that God has promised the Israelites to scout it out for the upcoming invasion. Most of the spies come back in a panic, forgetting that God has already given them the land. This leads to a revolt, with the people refusing to take the land. God gives them their wish, decreeing that the whole generation will die in the wilderness, and the land will be taken by their children.

Judges is the book for the last week of September. In it, we read about the ups and downs of the Israelites as they navigate life in The Promised Land: their periods of faithfulness and periods of unfaithfulness to God; their captivity from nearby nations and times of freedom and peace. And, our Sunday School children will be studying the book, too! Get ready for the roller coaster ride!




