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From Our Pastor: Sacred History

Most years one of my Christmas gifts from Renee will be a desk calendar, with some interesting theme for the year. This year's calendar is one of my favorites: "This Day in History." Every day of the year the calendar lists something that happened "on this date."

Sometimes it recalls a catastrophe, sometimes it is an interesting discovery, sometimes it is something amusing. Here are a few samples:

- Feb. 20: In 1962 John Glenn became the first American to orbit planet earth.
- Feb. 19: In 1945 30,000 U.S. Marines landed at Iwo Jima.
- Feb. 14: In 1876 Alexander Graham Bell applied for a patent for the telephone.
- Feb. 6: In 1952 Queen Elizabeth II ascended to the throne after the death of King George VI.
- Feb. 5: In 1922 the first issue of Reader's Digest was printed.
- Feb. 4: In 2004 Mark Zuckerberg founded Facebook.

Sometimes you read an event and you think: I did not know that was so long ago. Other times you read an event and you think: I didn't know it was that recent. For one thing, it seems like we have lived with Facebook forever! But no; just since 2004.

All of this reminds me of the fact that as Christians we practice a Faith that is itself rooted in history.

The Bible is not a book of legend, myth, or fable. There are of course times that Jesus teaches using a parable; and the parable is "a story with a point." But that does not mean that the broader narrative of the Bible is to be taken as a parable.

When the Bible says that God parted the Red Sea it means that in a literal sense. The event is obviously a miracle (and a pretty big one, too!); but we take that passage to mean that the actual nation of Israel, fleeing from the actual army of Egypt, actually walked on dry ground where water once stood.

It's a matter of history that Jesus was born in Bethlehem. It's a matter of history that He died on a cross on a Friday. It's a matter of history that He rose again from the dead on the Sunday that followed that Friday.

Those historical events can be called a "Sacred History" because they are a record of God's work to save us. That is, these are not mere facts. These also have meaning and purpose behind those facts.

But having said that, let's not forget that the narrative of Salvation is rooted in fact and event and truth.

As it turns out the Liturgical Calendar is essentially like my "This Day in History" calendar. On this date we celebrate the birth of the Savior. On this date we celebrate the establishment of the Supper. On this date we celebrate that He rose from the dead. On this date we celebrate that He sent the Holy Spirit.

These are the things God has done, historically and actually, and also to achieve the saving of His people.

As many of you know, I have recently been married, and there is great joy to be found in marriage. Scripture tells us that the union of a man and a woman is not merely a human institution but rather a sacred covenant designed by God. It reflects His love and faithfulness.



Marriage is built on love, sacrifice, and mutual service. In Ephesians 5:25, Paul writes, "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her." This verse reminds us that love in marriage is not just about emotions but about self-giving, just as Christ gave Himself for us.



Additionally, Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 teaches us about the strength found in companionship: "Two are better than one... For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow... And though a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him—a threefold cord is not quickly broken." A marriage centered on Christ is a strong and enduring bond, able to weather life's challenges with faith and perseverance.

In this sacred covenant, there is great joy in sharing life together and growing in Christ. However, marriage is not always easy. Yet, in Christ, we find the grace to love, forgive, and cherish one another, just as God has first loved us (1 John 4:19).

Paul also acknowledges that there may be times when a husband and wife need to step back and focus on God, but that they should ultimately come back together. As he writes in 1 Corinthians 7:5, "Do not deprive one another, except perhaps by agreement for a limited time, that you may devote yourselves to prayer; but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control." This verse reminds us that while difficulties may arise in marriage, reconciliation and unity should always be the goal.

To those who are married, may you continue to grow in love and faith together.

Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve." Matthew 4:10

Lent starts on Wednesday, Mar 5th and goes through Apr 17, 2025 this year. On Ash Wednesday Pastor puts the ash cross, symbolizing mortality and repentance, on our foreheads in remembrance of Christ who died on a cross for our sins.

During Lent we remember the 40 days that Jesus was fasting in the desert, enduring the temptations of Satan. Satan tempted Jesus 3 times. The first time, Satan tempted Jesus to turn stone into bread. The second time, Satan tempted Jesus to throw himself off a temple. The third time, Satan offered Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus would bow down and worship him. The committee has ordered new kneeling cushions for the altar. Made of 4" foam and fewer buttons than the current cushions, they are expected to be delivered by Easter Sunday.

Finally, after an assessment of our current organ this summer, it is time for the parish to initiate steps to purchase a replacement. The Board of Worship has spent the last several months assessing the current organ, meeting with various organ dealers, and visiting other churches to hear their digital organs.

At 25 years old, our current organ has exceeded its useful life. It is a discontinued model for which spare parts are no longer available. The board began researching available options in an effort to get ahead with the information-gathering process. Specs for a new Allen Organ are estimated to be \$110,000 and it is compatible with the current sound system. Each organ is custom built and can take up to five months from order to installation. And while this congregation has been richly blessed with a healthy balance of revenue and expenses, the significant costs associated with the purchase of a new organ cannot be supported by the church's budget alone.

The Worship Committee would like to invite members of the parish to join an organ committee to guide this parish through the next steps of raising funds to replace our organ. Please contact me if you would like to serve – lizrosinski@me.com or 803.413.3364.

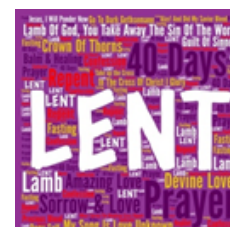

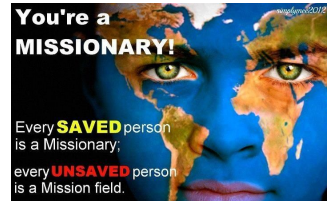
The Board of Evangelism: "Multiplying the Gospel" by Gospel X

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and Samaria, and as far as the remotest part of the earth." Acts 1:8

Jesus tells his disciples, and you today, that you will be his witness. You will be His witness in your local village, town and city (your "Jerusalem"). You will be His witness in your region and your country (your "Judea"). You will also be His witness in your neighboring countries and those countries and people groups you have some kind of hostility with (your "Samaria"). You will be His witness throughout the world, with no exceptions ("the ends of the earth").

Many missionaries have left their home countries to serve in other countries because of this task Jesus gave his disciples. Every disciple is called to be a witness. This does not mean that everyone needs to be a full-time missionary. On the contrary, some are called to do this witnessing full-time, but the majority of followers of Jesus are called to witness wherever they are, in a natural way.



Where are you living? Do you still live in your home town? Did you move? Is your natural setting "Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, or the end of the world"?

Have you ever thought about yourself as a missionary? A missionary, that witnesses naturally, wherever you are? Can you imagine God seeing you as a witness for your neighbors where you live? What thoughts are coming to your mind when you think about it?

If this stresses you, read Acts 1.8a again: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you". God does not expect you to do it out of your own power. He gave you the Holy Spirit who will help you, give you the strength, the courage, and the words. He is not expecting something from you that you cannot do. He gives you the help you need. In March, we continue with the final chapters of Leviticus. The purpose of Leviticus is to provide instruction and laws to guide a sinful, yet redeemed people in their relationship with a holy God. There is an emphasis in Leviticus on the need for personal holiness in response to a holy God. Sin must be atoned for through the offering of proper sacrifices. Other topics covered in the book are diet, childbirth, and diseases. Furthermore, the people of God are to be intentional in their personal, moral, and social living, in contrast to the practices of the pagan peoples who live around them.

The last half of March, we will move on to Revelation. This can be another confusing book filled with imagery of past, present, and future visions given to John the Apostle. If you were able to join Pr. Walt's Bible study of the Overview of the New Testament, he shed clarity on the book. And, you may want to supplement your reading with your Lutheran Study Bible commentary.

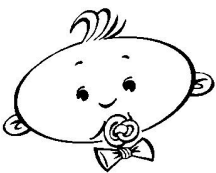
